The Canadian Federation of Nurses Unions (CFNU) Prairie Labour School provides an opportunity for members of the Manitoba Nurses Union (MNU), the Saskatchewan Union of Nurses (SUN) and the United Nurses of Alberta (UNA) to gather every two years to learn about issues that affect their working environment and an opportunity to network with each other. Our host province for the fifth Biennial CFNU Prairie Labour School is UNA.

The 2018 CFNU Prairie Labour School is offering three half day workshops that will be delivered concurrently. Each workshop will be delivered three times to allow participants the opportunity to circulate through each of the workshops. Two workshops will be delivered on Day 1- June 7 and the third will be delivered on Day 2 – June 8. Day 2 – June 8 will also include a short plenary session.

WORKSHOP #1

TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION: Building Understanding and Solidarity

In 2015 the Truth and Reconciliation Commission released its final report and 94 Calls to Action aimed at repairing the relationship between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples. These calls to action were directed at governments, the private and public sectors, and peoples just like you.

But three years later, how much progress has been made? What will it take to get us to reconciliation? Why do we need it in the first place?

This workshop will explore questions like:

- What does reconciliation mean?
- How do you practice it day-to-day?
- What does it mean for your role as a nurse?
- Who is responsible for it?

Join this interactive workshop as we explore with kindness, honesty, and humour, how we move forward together. This session is meant for all levels of understanding, is a place to ask questions in a safe space and build solidarity.

WORKSHOP #2

POLITICAL SAVVY Translated to Action

Everyone knows nurses are credible, knowledgeable spokespersons for health care. Nurses have the public's trust. When nurses work together, you make things happen!

But many nurses do not know how to unleash their individual and collective power to effect change. They may lack the knowledge of community, provincial and federal politics, and an understanding of how to influence health policy.

In this workshop, you will learn about government structure and decision making (provincial and federal) and how to exercise your political power. MNU Communications Officer Matt Austman and Researcher Mikaela Brooks will introduce techniques for mobilizing members, lobbying and getting your message across to employers, local leaders, the general public and politicians. You will have the opportunity to prepare factual information and practice speaking about issues that are important to you in your nursing work.

WORKSHOP #3

THE OPIOID CRISIS, Effects on Nurses, and the Role of the Union

The opioid crisis has far-reaching ramifications. Individuals and their families are affected, but they are not affected in a vacuum. Entire communities have been ravaged by this epidemic, causing officials to declare states of emergency. Healthcare workers are not immune from these effects either. Nurses are at the frontlines supporting people through this crisis, and their important work is met with political and institutional challenges. Additionally, in delivering the care required, nurses also bear the physical and emotional burdens of the opioid crisis.

In this workshop, you will learn about the opioid crisis, its political and institutional components, and the physical and mental tolls of delivering care in a safe consumption setting focused on harm reduction. In addition to examining the opioid crisis and its effects, particularly in relation to marginalized communities, you will have the opportunity to examine what support nurses need to safely, compassionately, and effectively deliver care. In this workshop, you will also discuss the role of unions in advocating for workers in these sites, what challenges union representatives face, and the employer's duty to accommodate.
